#### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

#### When are my taxes due?

Taxes are normally due November 15<sup>th</sup> and May 15<sup>th</sup>. The Town Council may occasionally change these dates if they fall on a weekend.

# How can I view my property tax bills?

You can access this information by going to the Town's website <u>www.gorham-me.org</u>. From the homepage go to "Town Departments" and then click on "Assessing Department". Scroll down to find the link for "Real Estate and Personal Property Tax Bills". Choose the desired year you would like to view. Choose the file with the first letter of the property owner's last name as of April 1<sup>st</sup>. If you are printing a copy of the tax bill, be sure to choose "print current page" or "print selected record" on the printer menu so you don't print the entire file.

#### How can I view my property assessment information?

You can access this information by going to the Town's website <u>www.gorham-me.org</u>. From the homepage go to "Town Departments" and then click on "Assessing Department". Scroll down to "Current Property Tax Data (Vision)". Click on the link to view information on property, including assessed value and photo of building(s).

# Do I have to apply for the Homestead Exemption or Veterans Exemption every year?

No. Once approved, your Homestead Exemption is in place and will carry over from year to year. If you move, you will have to submit an application for the new property.

#### Where can I get a burn permit?

Weather permitting; residents are able to obtain burning permits during the hours of 8:30am to 4:30pm, Monday through Friday and on Saturday and Sunday from 8:30am to 12:00pm at NO CHARGE. Burn permits are also available at no charge from the Town of Gorham website at www.burningpermit.com.

At other times you are able to obtain burning permits from <a href="http://www.maineburnpermit.com">http://www.maineburnpermit.com</a> at a fee of \$7.00, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

#### What do I need to get my car registered?

For **FIRST** time registrations, the person or persons to whom the vehicle is being registered must come in to process the registration. Anyone can re-register a vehicle.

#### Do you accept credit cards?

The Town of Gorham offers the convenience of accepting credit cards for payments. A non-refundable convenience fee will be applied to cardholders who wish to pay via credit card or debit card. The Town has accepted debit cards for payments in the past without a convenience fee; however, the fees charged to the town by the bank to process these transactions have steadily increased. A convenience fee will be required in order to allow the town the option to accept payments via credit card or debit card. The fee will be disclosed at the time of the transaction payment with the option for the cardholder to decline the fee and make the payment via check or cash. The fee will be 2.45% of the transaction amount (with a \$1.50 minimum) except for payments made with a Visa consumer check/debit card (not a Visa credit card) which will have a flat fee of \$3.95.

#### What do I need to obtain a passport?

You will need to complete a passport application, which is available in the Town Clerk's Office, or you may download one from the U. S. Department of State's website, <u>www.travel.state.gov</u>. Once the application form is completely filled out, <u>but not signed</u>, bring it in with a **CERTIFIED** copy

of your birth certificate (a certified copy has a raised seal). You will need identification; this can be a valid driver's license. You will also need two identical 2x2 full-face photos; these can be taken here at the Town office for a \$10.00 fee. If you have previously had a U. S. passport, you must submit it with your application. If the previous passport is lost, a statement can be completed at time of application for the new one.

You will also need two forms of payment: 1): A check or money order, payable to The U.S. Department of State and a payment to the Town of Gorham that can be by check, cash or credit/debit card. The payment for the U.S. Department of State is as follows: For the passport book, Adult \$110.00, child (15 and under) \$80.00 and for the passport card (land & sea crossings only to Canada & Mexico) Adult \$30.00, child (15 and under) \$15.00. If you need your passport in less than 6 weeks, you can have it expedited for an extra charge of \$60.00. If you need your passport in less than 3 weeks, you will have to make an appointment with the Boston passport agency to process your application.

For children under 14 years of age: The application requires signatures of both parents who need to show a parental relationship. This can be a birth certificate and other identification. If a parent has sole custody, they need to show either a written consent from the absent parent or legal evidence of sole custody. If one parent can not be present at the time of application they will need to provide a notarized statement giving their permission for their child to apply for a passport.

#### What types of services are available online? www.gorham-me.org

Many services that are available at the Municipal Center are also available online and some are listed below. Depending on your need, there are also many forms and applications on the website from the various Department pages.

# When will my trash be picked up? What if there is a holiday?

There are several different trash pick up days, depending on where you live. You can look up your area by logging onto the Town website and going to the "Trash and Recycling Information" link from the Public Works Department page. You will also find alternate schedule information as well as other useful information on recycling.

#### REPORT OF THE TOWN MANAGER

It is my pleasure to provide the Annual Report for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010 to the Town Council and citizens of Gorham.

During the year, economists advised us that we were no longer in a recession. That may have been correct, but the economy provided a weak recovery with limited job growth. Locally, Gorham experienced some new home construction and issued 62 permits for single family and condominium dwelling units. This is a 129% increase from the 2008/09 fiscal year, which may sound impressive, but this percentage increase is based on the anemic 27 permits issued the prior year, the lowest amount issued in many years. A better comparison to normal would be the 111 permits issued in fiscal year 2005/06. As you can see, the rebound is encouraging, but still far below normal permit activity.

The weak economy continued to affect the operation of the Town's government. For the third year in a row, non property tax revenues were expected to be lower for the fiscal year. Once again, the Town Council had the unenviable choice of either reducing services or increasing property taxes during a weak economy as it worked on the budget for the 2009/10 fiscal year. As usual, the Town Council went to work with the goal of producing a budget that would continue to provide quality essential services without a tax increase. In the end, the Town Council was able to adopt a budget that reduced the property tax rate from \$16 to \$15.90 resulting in the 3<sup>rd</sup> year in a row without an increase in the tax rate.

Although the economic environment continued to be very challenging, the Town made good progress on a number of issues important to the Town.

In September 2008, the voters approved a new elementary school. R J Grondin, a local Gorham contractor, started site work on the construction on the new school in the Fall of 2009. Construction began in the Spring of 2010. The project will cost approximately \$25.83 million with the State paying 89.9%, local tax payers paying 9.6% and 0.6% coming from a grant. This school will be heated and air conditioned with geothermal energy and will be well insulated and energy efficient. The project, which is located on Stevens Drive off of Route 237, is on schedule and expected to be completed and open for students in the Fall of 2011. When it opens in 2011, the school should alleviate some of the over crowding in the school system.

In last year's Annual Report, I reported on the Town's participation in a Highway Study called the East-West Gorham Corridor Study conducted at the request of the Towns of Gorham and Scarborough and Cities of Westbrook and South Portland. The four communities are seeking to build on the improvements made with the Bernard P. Rines Highway that created a Bypass of Gorham Village. As intended, the new Bernard P. Rines Highway produced substantial reductions in traffic congestion in Gorham Village but did not address traffic congestion in other areas of the transportation corridor. During the past year, the Study Committee and a separate Advisory Committee held numerous meetings as the Study proceeded to look at how land use patterns, mass transit options and new road capacity collectively could reduce traffic congestion in the future and provide a more efficient transportation system. This Study is expected to be completed in the Fall of 2010.

In September 2008, the Town Council adopted an updated Master Plan for the Chick Property located behind the Public Safety building. That action was followed by the Town obtaining a Site Permit from the Maine Department of Environmental Protection. A Site Permit should have been obtained in 1980 when the Narragansett School was constructed; however, neither the Town nor the Maine DEP could find a copy of a permit. The new permit covered the prior work on the Chick property and also permitted projects in the newly adopted Master Plan. In April 2010, the Town obtained its local permit from the Planning Board to construct Phase 1 of the Master Plan. The Town Council accepted a bid from RJ Grondin's to do the project. Funds for the work on this project came from the 2005 Bond that voters approved to renovate the current Municipal Center. That bond also provided funds for improvements to the Chick property and Public Safety Building. Phase 1 is intended to provide a storm water detention pond required by new Federal and State Stormwater management rules, a new access road and new parking facilities. The project is expected to be completed by Fall 2010.

In March, Maureen Finger, our Finance Director, Hollis Cobb, the School Business Manager, and I went to Boston to meet with representatives of Moody's and Standard and Poors, who are credit rating agencies, to make a presentation about the Town of Gorham in preparation of issuing the bonds to finance the new Elementary School. Both rating agencies subsequently provided very good ratings to the Town of Gorham (Moody's rating was A1 and Standard and Poors rating was AA) and in late March, the Town successfully sold it \$20,385,000 bonds with an interest rate of 3.71% from Morgan Stanley. The bond issue is for 20 years.

In April, the Town Council authorized a referendum for up to \$3 million in road construction and up to \$450,000 to purchase a new Squad Truck for the Fire Department. That referendum question went to the voters in June 2010 and was approved. With voter approval of this bond issue, we began preparations to issue the new bonds during the summer of 2010.

During the past year, the Town Council also accepted 3 new roads that added 0.53 miles of new public roads to be maintained. The 3 new roads include:

- Peregrine Drive
- Falcon Crest Drive
- Barnfield Lane

The Town Council also updated the Cable TV Policy and approved funding to add Streaming Video to allow residents to watch Town Council, Planning Board and School Board meetings on their computer screens while the meetings are in progress or to look at archived meetings at their leisure. This new service is expected to be available in August or September 2010 and will provide flexibility and convenience for our citizens who watch our meetings.

In July 2009, the Town found out that its application for grant funds to construct a Fire Station in the Little Falls and West Gorham area had not been successful. There was strong national competition for those funds and unfortunately no application from a municipality in the State of Maine succeeded. However, the Town was successful in obtaining a grant to install solar panels at the Municipal Center to produce electricity from the sun and a grant to help pay the costs of renovating the sidewalks at the intersection of Routes 25 and 114 in Gorham Village. Both of those projects will take some time to implement as we work with the grant funding programs. At their June 2010 meeting, the Town Council

also authorized staff to submit a grant application for a 1.5 mile walking and bike trail between New Portland Road and Hutcherson Drive. The results of this application will not be known for a while.

In June, the Town Council made a decision to take possession of a property located at 27 Preble Street that had been owned by Gamma Omega of Phi Kappa Sig Fraternity. Over the course of time, the property owners had failed to pay their property taxes, and tax liens for 4 different years had matured with approximately \$27,000 owed to the Town. In addition, there had been past violations and also code violations of the life safety code. The Police had been called to the property and neighborhood many times because of activity associated with the property.

Every year I note the tremendous contribution of the many volunteers that serve our community. Volunteers serve as coaches in our Recreation programs, provide valuable help at Baxter Memorial Library, and serve on various Boards and Committees. The quality of life in Gorham is greatly enhanced because of the work of our volunteers and help to make Gorham a very special place to live, work and raise a family. I would like to take this opportunity to express my appreciation to our volunteers who generously donate their time.

Finally, I would like to express my sincere appreciation to all of the Town's employees for their continued commitment and service to the Gorham community.

#### **Code Enforcement Office**

After 15 years of service, Code Enforcement Officer Clint Cushman retired this year. The position has been filled by Code Enforcement Officer David Twomey. The following services are provided by the Code Enforcement Office: review applications and issue permits (building, electrical, plumbing, septic system, sign and use permits), conduct inspections, assist the public with zoning matters, assessing information, (copies, deeds, etc.), investigate complaints and enforce ordinances, codes and certain state laws, and provide staff support for the Zoning Board of Appeals. The CEO sits on the Site Plan Review Committee and confers with the Planning Department. The CEO and Assistant CEO review building plans and proposals going to the Planning Board and Site Plan Review Committee, work closely with the Fire Department to ensure compliance with related codes, administer the Small Community Grant Program for the replacement of malfunctioning septic systems for qualified applicants, and work in conjunction with the State Electrical Inspectors Office, State Planning Office and the DEP to ensure compliance with relevant state and local laws and ordinances. The CEO interprets ordinances and codes and makes determinations on ambiguous or questionable parts thereof (subject to appeal).

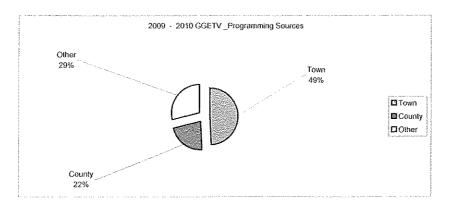

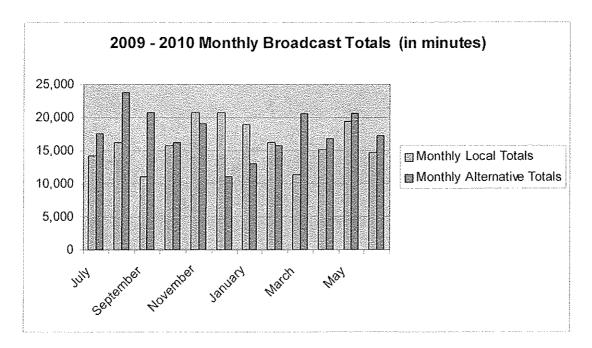

### TOWN OF GORHAM PLANNING DEPARTMENT

The Planning Department provides planning assistance and technical support to the Planning Board, the Site Plan Review Committee, the Town Council and the general public. The staff coordinates the review of all proposed land use development applications requiring approval by the Planning Board or Site Plan Review Committee. The Department also oversees special planning projects, the development and adoption of new ordinances and amendments to the Land Use and Development Code, as well as the Official Zoning Map of the Town.

During the current fiscal year, the Planning Department processed applications for 41 new developments and amendments to previously approved projects: 23 have been approved, 5 were withdrawn, and 13 were carried forward for completion in FY 2011. The Planning Board and staff also prepared and/or reviewed 11 proposed zoning amendments, with 8 being adopted by the Town Council and 13 being carried forward for completion in FY 2011.

#### PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

The Town of Gorham's Public Works Department is primarily responsible for the maintenance of over 141 miles of Town roads and 14.98 miles of State roads. This road maintenance work includes, but is not limited to, the maintenance of pavement (summer and winter), markings and striping, signage, bridges, culverts, ditches, traffic lights, trees, picking up dead animals and trash in the roadway, mowing of grass within the roadway, cleaning of catch basins, and street sweeping. In addition to roadway maintenance, Public Works also conducts capital road improvement projects, building, cemetery and facility maintenance, cemetery burials, mowing and trimming of Town grounds, and oversees the curbside collection "Pay-Per-Bag" and recycling program. Public Works, through the Public Works Director, assists with development plan review and construction and coordinates the Town's GIS Program. Public Works also assists every other Town Department and the School System in a variety of capacities when needed.

# PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT TRANSFER STASTION SOLID WASTE AND RECYCLING

The Public Works Department maintains the two existing closed landfills, including the administration of the required water testing program.

The transfer station is open for grass clipping drop-off during normal business hours and is open by appointment noon to 1 p.m. Monday through Thursday for the disposal of motor oil. The transfer station is also open during two Saturdays in the spring and two Saturdays in the fall for brush disposal.

The Pay-Per-Bag curbside program began in July 1, 2002 and includes the collection of solid waste and recyclable materials. The current 5-year average tonnage of solid waste brought to EcoMaine from the Town of Gorham is 2,289.32 tons. 162,500 15-gallon trash bags and 99,125 33-gallon trash bags were sold in FY10.

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#### RECREATION DEPARTMENT

Gorham Recreation Department provides people of all ages opportunities for activities and experiences that support healthy living and community involvement. The Department offers wide a variety of youth and adult sports programs, family outdoor recreation opportunities including hiking, biking, skiing, canoeing and a host of community special events including concerts, festivals, holiday celebrations and camp activities for grades K-8 on a year round basis.
